CYM Retreat 2019: A Witness to the Fountain

(August 2-3, before the start of Canadian Yearly Meeting in Session)

Early Friends took a radical view of the scriptures, calling it "a witness to the fountain but not the fountain itself" and proclaiming that "Christ is come to teach his people himself."

While other Christians at the time referred to the scriptures as the Word of God, early Friends proclaimed that what they variantly called the Root, the Light, the Seed, or the living Spirit of the Divine, was the Word of God. God had yet more Light to break forth from his Word.

What is our experience today of the written scriptures? What role have they played in our own spiritual journey? How have they influenced our faith community, and how do we respond to both the positive and negative role they presently play in the world?

Our retreat will take the form of a meeting for learning. As in meeting for worship we will gather as equals, seeking the truth, willing to share and explore together for deeper understanding.



- 1. It is essential that you approach your Monthly Meeting with your request as soon as possible. If more than one person in a family is applying, you should discuss your needs with your Monthly Meeting, remembering that funding comes from the donations of other Friends.
- 2. If your Meeting does not meet in time for their minute of support to be sent with your application before the deadline, apply anyway. This will help the office know what demands are being made on the available funds. Your application will be held until the minute is received.
- 3. It is essential that this application be submitted as soon as possible. The CYM Office Staff will work collaboratively to determine eligibility and disburse financial support as applications are received.
- 4. It is suggested that Friends pay for half their travel costs, if possible.
- 5. Friends can apply up to a maximum of \$480 per person in financial assistance. Friends who were born in 1984 or later can apply for a maximum of \$750 per person, which they may use for costs associated with attending CYM Session and/or the Young Friend's Gathering. Friends are asked to submit all travel receipts to the office as soon as available.
 - Applications must be received in the Yearly Meeting office **no later than June 30, 2019**.
- 6. Late applications will be considered <u>if</u> funds are still available.
- 7. If you receive funds and cannot attend the sessions, please return the funds and let the Yearly Meeting office know as soon as possible so that the money can be released for another Friend.

Friends applying after the June 30th deadline should anticipate a delay in processing and receiving funds.

Food Coop Coordinator for CYM 2019

The Coordinator facilitates food preparation, manages food storage, ensures safe food handling practices and (if the Coordinator desires) modifies preset shopping lists and menu choices in consultation with the Food Coop and Local Arrangements committees.

The Coordinator has volunteers available for site set-up and maintenance, financial control, food shopping, preparation, and clean up. Food Coop participants typically sign themselves up for volunteer shifts throughout the week that CYM is in session.

The Coordinator is on duty from mid-day Thursday, August 1 to next Saturday, August 11. This includes a two-day start-up shopping-planning period preceding the first meal, which is Saturday supper on August 3rd.

The Coordinator will attend for four hours at each of two meals a day — breakfast is completely in the hands of Coop participants.

We are seeking someone who is familiar with volunteer organizations and sensitive to the Quaker values of simplicity and community building. The person may or may not be a member of the Religious Society of Friends. The Coordinator also doesn't have to be just one person; it could be a shared position. An honorarium of \$900 is available.
