A Land and Treaty Acknowledgement for Canadian Yearly Meeting

On Sunday 8 August I had the privilege of facilitating the Land and Treaty acknowledgement for Canadian Yearly Meeting. Program Committee had chosen Winnipeg as the acknowledgement location for 2021. A significant part of my learning journey about a what it means to be a Settler partner in the Treaty relationship has come from three sources, all of which I share with you:

- The book *Breathing Life into the Stone Fort Treaty: An Anishinabe Understanding of Treaty One* by Aimée Craft, an Anishinaabe lawyer. In fact, as part of my Settler contribution to the 150th commemoration of the making of that Treaty, I am sending copies of Aimée Craft's book to three royals Elizabeth II, Charles, and William. I suspect that their English education may have missed this important understanding.
- Helping to plan and carry out the annual We Are All Treaty People Celebration
 that was initiated by Winnipeg Quaker Meeting and local Mennonites in
 response to the Calls to Action of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission.
 This celebration has led to a growing relationship with the Treaty Relations
 Commission of Manitoba (TRCM) and its Commissioner, Loretta Ross. This
 relationship is how I was able to invite Loretta Ross to welcome CYM as part of
 this year's on-line gathering.
- Helping to develop Share the Gifts-Honour the Treaties a reparations-based organization also helped me to build a relationship with the Treaty Relations Commission of Manitoba and its former Commissioner, Jamie Wilson.

All three sources contributed to the development of this year's CYM Treaty and Land acknowledgement.
