Meeting for Worship with Attention to Business, session 2 at 16:00 Eastern Time Today's agenda includes consideration for approval of a CAST recommendation re CYM 2022 that was presented for discussion at the CYM Meeting for Worship for Business, held on Saturday 12June and seemed to be favourably accepted. An unchanged version was appended to the agenda and is available at Read CYM Documents. We will also consider the request from Cowichan Valley Monthly Meeting to revise the CYM minute of record on marriage. The Clerks note that since the original minute was discerned and proposed by Continuing Meeting of Ministry and Counsel. CYM may choose to ask: Continuing Meeting of Ministry and Counsel to consult with LGTPQ2S+ Friends and other groups and/or individuals as appropriate. Then CMM&T could prepare a new minute of record to bring to Yearly Meeting of Ministry and Counsel MM&C for approval and forwarding to the y Meeting for Worship for Business at Canadian Yearly Meeting in 2022. Other items on the agenda include the CYM State of Society Report and the first reading of the Canadian Yearly Meeting Epistle.

Canadian Friends Service Committee at 18:30 Eastern Time

For this evening's program, members of the Canadian Friends Service Committee will present an overview of Friends' current peace and social justice work, including CFSC's structure, its connection to the Yearly Meeting, current areas of work, and communications tools. Presenters include Lana Robinson (CFSC Clerk), Dalya Eidda (CFSC Administrator), Nancy Russell (Criminal Justice Program Coordinator), Jennifer Preston (Indigenous Rights Program Coordinator), and Matt Legge (Peace Program Coordinator). There will also be time to ask questions.

Continuing Meeting of Ministry and Counsel Open Meeting, at 20:00 Eastern Time In light of changes coming to CYM, this is a good time to renew our focus on the spiritual priorities of our meetings during CYM in session and in local meetings. CMM&C has heard from Friends who desire a deeper, more self-disciplined worship, and from young Friends seeking a deeper connection with the Quaker tradition. According to *Organization and Procedure*, CMM&C provides care and support for Meetings for Worship across Canada, the worship that underlies the business sessions at CYM, and matters relating to worship or the living out of our faith and testimonies as Friends. Yet CMM&C often feels hampered in exercising their responsibility by widespread liberal Quaker insistence that worship and ministry are purely private matters, not subject to community standards. Friends will be invited to meet in small groups to consider the following queries:

- * How do you understand the role of your local Ministry and Counsel (M&C)?
- * How do you understand the role of CMM&C?
- * What services/assistance would you like to see coming from your local M&C?
- * What services/assistance would you like to see coming from CMM&C?
- * Who, or those in what role, provides eldering in your meeting?
- * What role should eldering play amongst today's Friends?
