from Canadian Mennonite University, (30 min. walking/5 min. driving):

Assiniboine Forest—the trail head is at 3000 Grant Avenue (Grant Avenue and Chalfont Rd), though you can find your way into the forest from the skirts of the CMU campus. Google Assiniboine Forest.

Assiniboine Park is a five minute walk north down Shaftsbury Boulevard. See the free attractions: English Gardens, Leo Mol Statue Garden, Nature Playground. www.assiniboinepark.ca

The Leaf Conservatory is in Assiniboine Park too; browse through the free outdoor prairie gardens or check out the indoor conservatory for an entrance fee. www.assiniboinepark.ca/leaf/lifegrows

Walk through Niizhoziibeən (pronounced Nee-zho-zhi-been and meaning two rivers in Ojibway) the point of land rehabilitated to honour our city's Indigenous heritage and its prominent place alongside the Red and Assiniboine Rivers. See the Niimaamaa sculpture ("my mother"). Stop in at Agowiidiwinan Centre, the Manitoba Treaty Relations Commission's learning centre that teaches about treaties through visual and interactive tools. Check out the Forks Market, take a water taxi, or visit the Children's Museum

From the Forks, walk southward over the Riel Esplanade into St. Boniface, where you'll find the **St Boniface Museum** msbm.mb.ca. Louis Riel rests in the nearby St. Boniface Cathedral Cemetery. Contact the Louis Riel Institute to join in on historic metis walking or bus tours www.louisrielinstitute.ca/metis-tours

Northward from the Forks is **Winnipeg Historic Exchange District**, where many of the buildings still remember that Winnipeg was to have been the Chicago of the North. Check out a variety of different walking tours www.exchangedistrict.org/historic-walking-tours-2/
